Mandatory Language for Monitoring and Reporting Violation Chemical Sampling CHEMICAL MONITORING, ROUTINE MAJOR

The **SJWTX Triple Peak Plant** water system **PWS ID TX0460172** has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to collect and submit chemical samples of water provided to their customers, and report the results of those samples to the TCEQ on a regular basis.

We failed to monitor and/or report the following constituents <u>Total Haloacetic Acids (HAA5) and</u> Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs)

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from chemical contamination. We did not complete all monitoring and/or reporting for chemical constituents, and therefore TCEQ cannot be sure of the safety of your drinking water during that time.

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

The Texas Water Company expedited payment to laboratory to release results of samples that were conducted during this period for TCEQ review and are currently re-evaluating our payment process to ensure no further administrative oversight within our accounts payable department.
